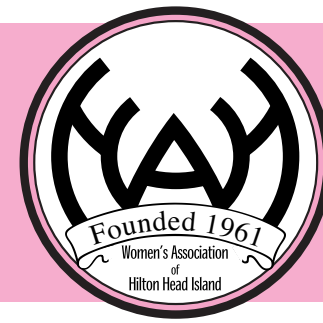

The Fascinating Paintings of Artists Cassandra Gillens and Bellamy Murphy will be displayed all around the ballroom and will be available for purchase. David Lauderdale of The Island Packet will capture your imagination as he shares Low Country Colorful Stories represented in the art.



Cassandra Gillens: Cassandra's fondest memories of her early childhood years in South Carolina moved her to paint these visions of the Low Country's comforting southern culture and images of good old southern living. From her youth, she dreamt of one day returning to the place that won her heart and spirit, and upon her return, became closely connected with life stories of the people and culture she so loved. Cassandra's paintings show that love with vivid saturated colors and simplification of forms, keeping her true to the style of Fauvism, which was extremely influential in the evolution of 20th century art.



Bellamy Murphy: I love the coast - its colors, its smells, its ebbs and flows, and just everything about it. I love to paint, I love color and design, the home, family, cooking, music, and it all coming together. When I paint or design something, I think of it as an integral part of someone's life, above their family's sideboard or favorite chair, hoping it is going to bring the coast and its energy into their everyday life. My greatest compliment is when someone tells me my art makes them feel good or evokes a good memory about being on the water.



David Lauderdale has covered the Lowcountry for more than three decades for The Island Packet and The Beaufort Gazette.
